Ensure optimum development and dynamic use of Europe's intellectual capital in order to generate new skills, knowledge and innovation

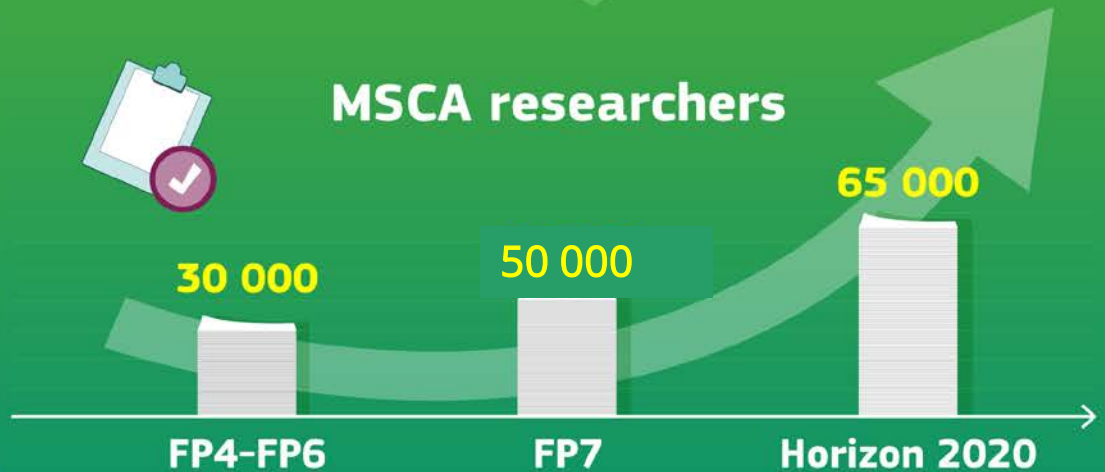

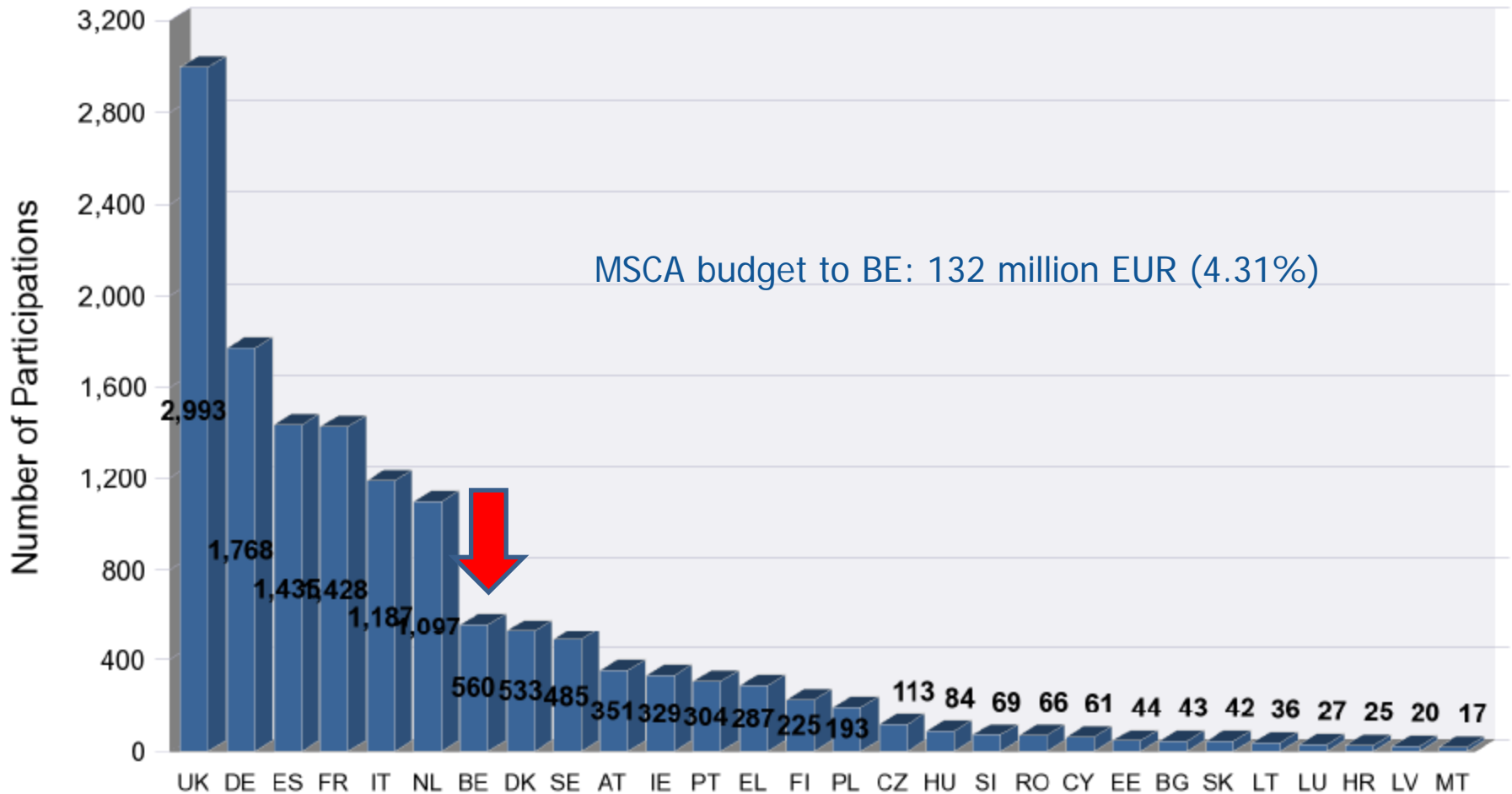

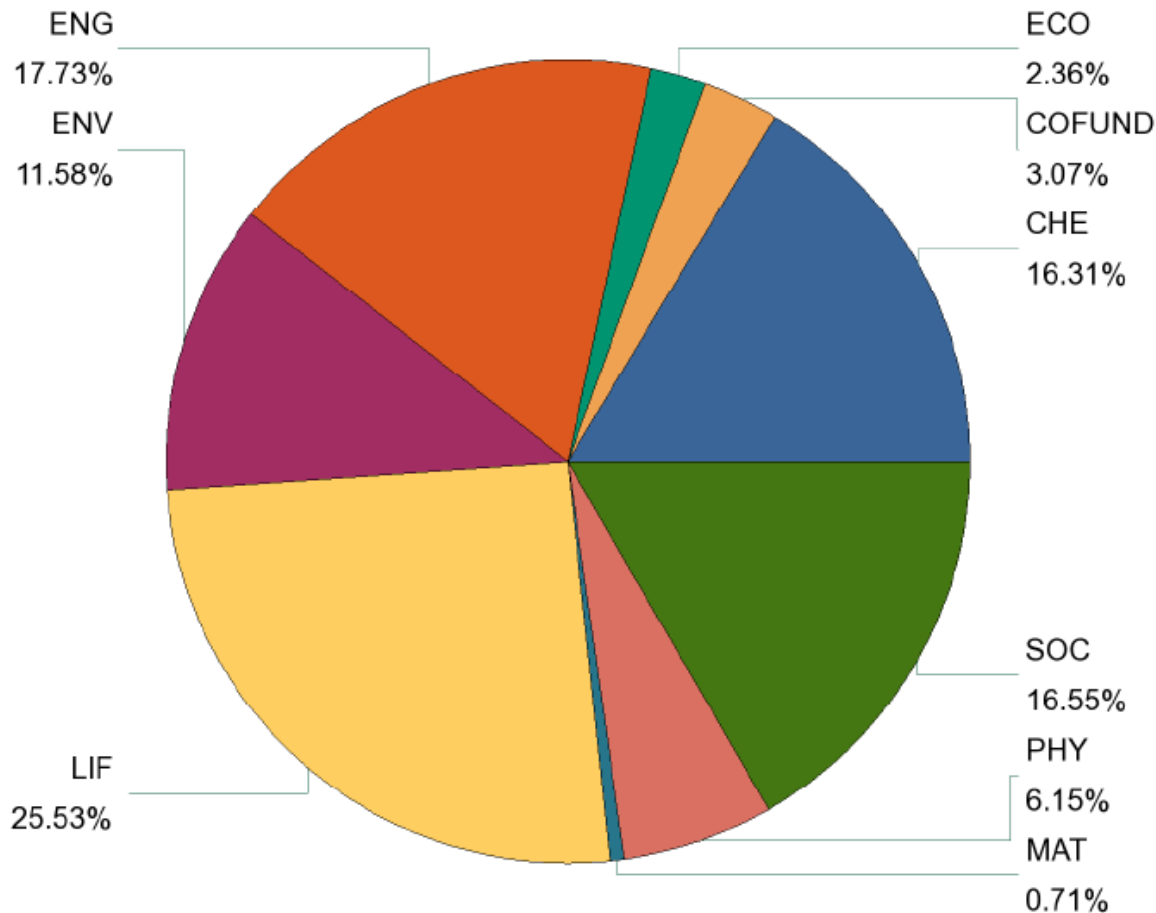

SOC: *social sciences & humanities*

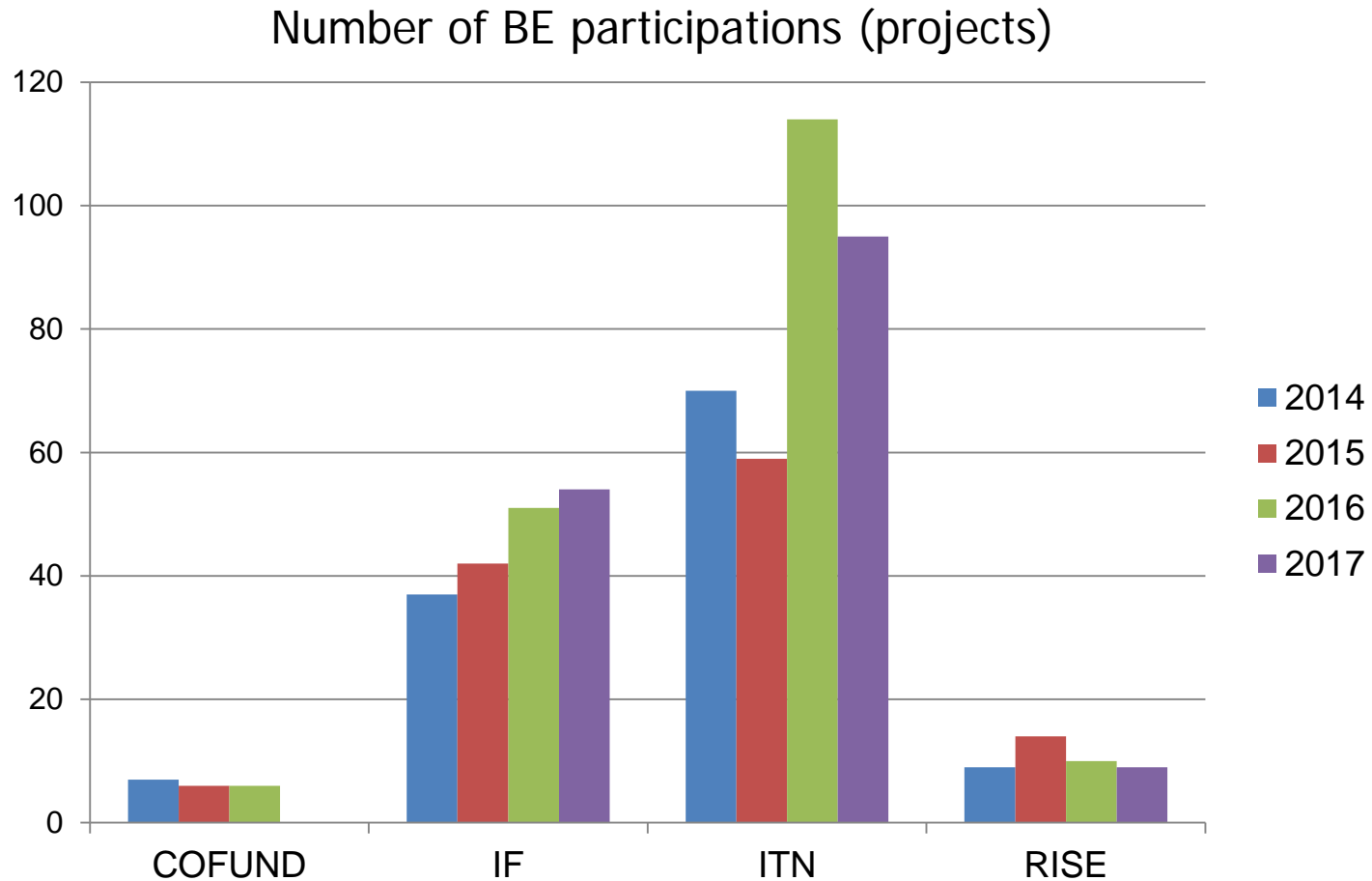

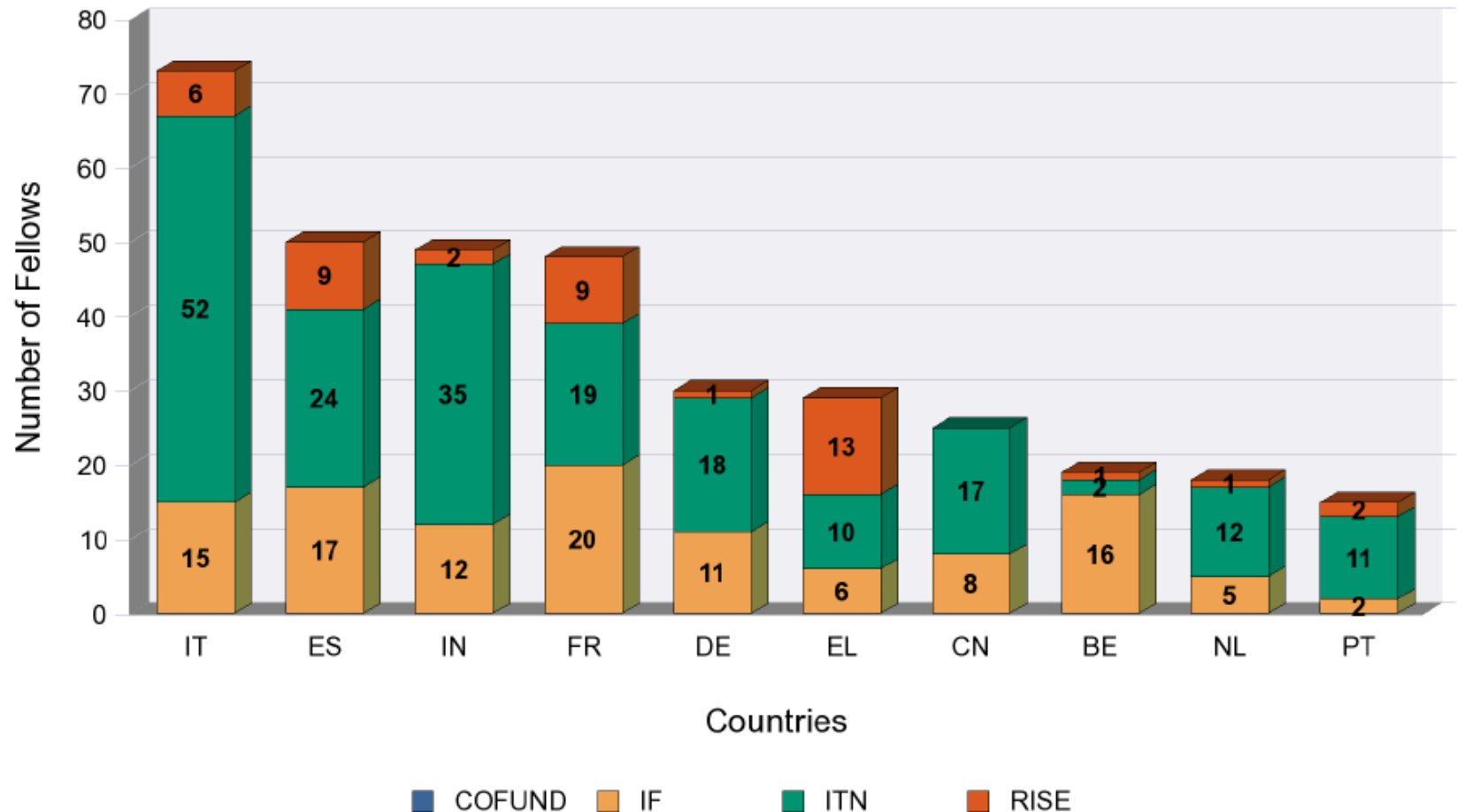

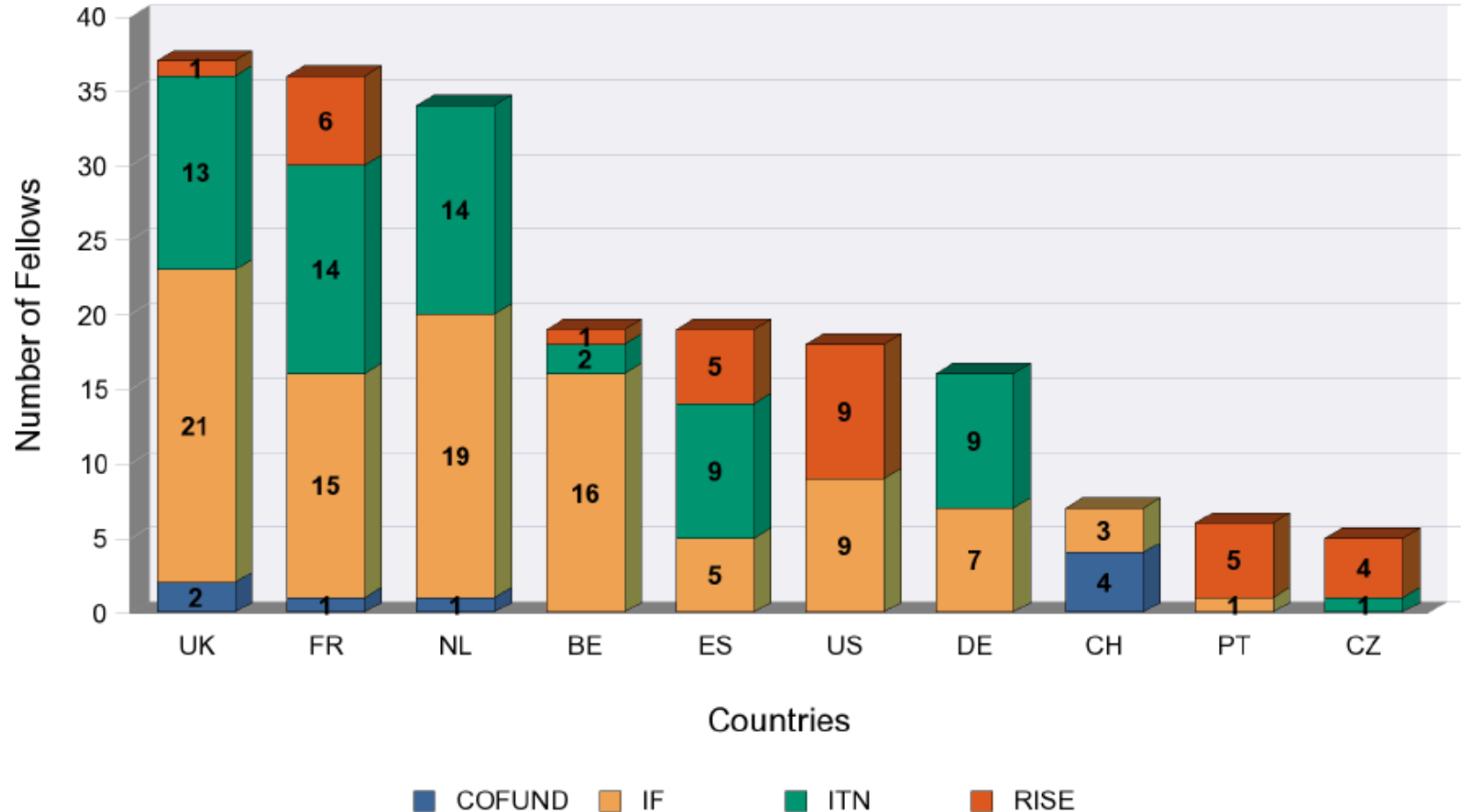

2018-2020 WP: what's new? (1)

ITN

- 1** Cover costs for short secondments (up to 6 months) of researchers in ITN with the Research, Training and Networking costs
 - > Should cover at least **travel and accommodation costs**.
- 2** Revised rule on international mobility in European Industrial Doctorates (EIDs)
 - > Inter-sectoral mobility between beneficiaries **must be international**.
 - > Mobility to partner organisations is aligned with standard European Training Network (ETN) rules: **limited to 30%**; can be **international or not**.
- 3** European Joint Doctorates (EJDs): Researchers must take their joint degree always within Europe or with a European beneficiary

- 1** IF Career Restart Panel (CAR) and Reintegration Panel (RI) are strengthened
 - > Maximum duration of **CAR prolonged to 36 months**.
 - > **More budget** for both panels.
- 2** Part-time work for IF to pursue supplementary activities, such as creating a business, advanced studies, etc.
 - > **Agreement between supervisor and fellow necessary**.
 - > Minimum working time in MSCA: **≥ 50%**.
 - > **Proportional extension** of project.
- 3** Possibility to spend time at the European beneficiary before the outgoing mobility
 - > **Max. 3 months** (part of outgoing phase to ensure knowledge transfer when back).

2018-2020 WP: what's new? (2)



▶ **Optional introductory training for all MSCA fellows**

- > **Training on skills** necessary to face the challenges of tomorrow (such as digital-ly-enabled open science and FAIR data management, responsible research and innovation, communication and outreach, project management).
- > **Information on their career** as MSCA researchers (rights and obligations as fellows, EU support for innovation, possibilities for worldwide collaboration).

More flexibility for third-country researchers through a revised long-term residency rule*:

- > **Only residence counts**, and not research activity and residence as before.
- > **Periods of absence are now allowed** during the 5 years of legal and continuous residence within EU Member States or Horizon 2020 Associated Countries.
- > **Refugees**, even though they are third-country citizens, **do not have to comply with the long-term residency rule when applying to the Reintegration Panel.**

New financial support: MSCA Special needs

What?

Additional financial support to enable MSCA **participation** and **mobility** of **disabled researchers**

Which MSCA actions are concerned?

All MSCA actions

Who can benefit from this allowance?

Only eligible MSCA researchers with disabilities

Type of grant?

Grant awarded for the **purchase of items/services**

- > **Lump sum** grant to beneficiary
- > **Capped at EUR 60 000/researcher**

How will it be implemented?

As a **separate grant** to the beneficiary of the main MSCA grant

From when?

Tentatively available as of **first quarter of 2019** (retroactively to all ongoing projects)

2018-2020 WP: what's new? (4)

Widening Fellowships (WF)

- specific support to researchers to undertake their fellowship in a "widening country"
- contribution to spreading excellence and closing the still apparent Research & Innovation gap within Europe
- implemented through the *Spreading Excellence and Widening Participation* part of the Horizon 2020 Work Programme 2018-20, in line with MSCA's high standards
- Which countries are concerned?



Member States: Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia and Slovenia.

Associated Countries: Albania, Armenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Faroe Islands, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Georgia, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Tunisia, Turkey and Ukraine.

Towards Horizon Europe

1. The Horizon 2020 interim evaluation
 2. Lamy Report (LAB-FAB-APP)
 3. Members States' & stakeholders' views on FP9
- ⇒ Commission proposal for Horizon Europe (7 June)

MSCA interim evaluation findings

- MSCA remains very **relevant** to challenges faced by EU (incl. setting standards) and appreciated by stakeholders
- Programme is being run efficiently but is **underfunded**
- Fosters **excellent science**, e.g., fellows twice as likely as average researchers to publish in top 1%/5% cited publications + 70% say they reached the next career stage faster thanks to MSCA
- Coherent with H2020, but: **increase uptake of ESIF** with H2020
- Only 6% of projects not funded by MSCA due to lack of budget were implemented at national level
- Effective: 1 in 4 fellows outside EU or AC + **MSCA account for more than half of all Third Country participations in Horizon 2020** + 45% of fellows experience cross-sectoral mobility
- Positive **structuring effect** on organisations (e.g. training, OTM-R)

Lamy Report's advice ~ MSCA

- FP9 has to "reinforce EU's human capital"
- "Achieve synergies with ESIF" & "Better align EU and national funding"
- "Simplify"
- FP9 should "increase resources for MSCA"
- MSCA: introduce "Industry Research Fellowship scheme"
- Be "open to talent from everywhere (incl. innovators)"

Our aims for MSCA in Horizon Europe

- Evolution, no revolution
- Keep it simple and straightforward
- A higher budget
- Deal with low success rates
- Support another 100,000 researchers & careers in FP9

MSCA in Horizon Europe: Proposed intervention areas

1. Nurturing Excellence through Mobility of Researchers across Borders, Sectors and Disciplines
2. Fostering new Skills through Excellent Training of Researchers
3. Strengthening Human Capital and Skills Development across the European Research Area
4. Improving and Facilitating Synergies
5. Reaching out to Stakeholders and the General Public
